



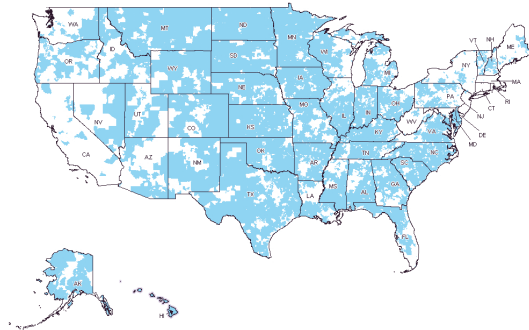

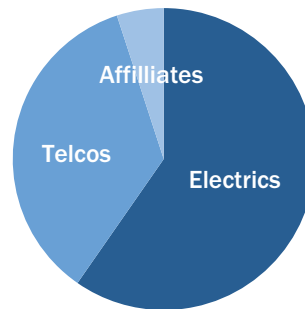

Today, NRTC members serve millions of customers in areas of the country that have been historically unserved or underserved by traditional utilities and other businesses. NRTC members serve 80% of U.S. counties

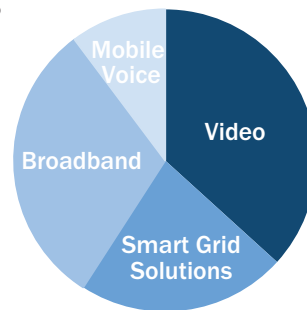

The NRTC Difference

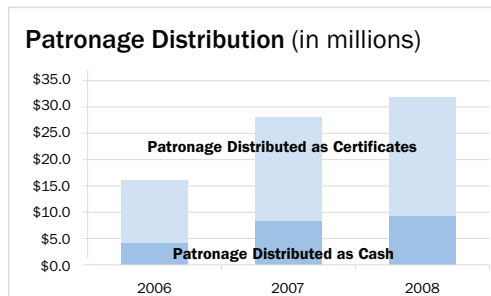
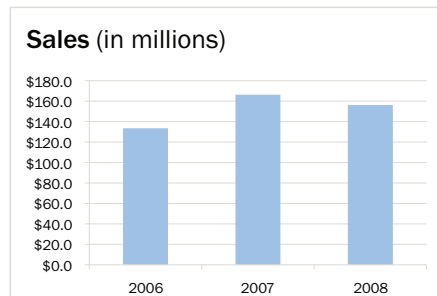
